

# Current regulation for visitors



## For visitors of the clinic St. Hedwig

Dear visitors to the Clinic St. Hedwig,

the applicable measures (and regulations) are meant to protect our patients, their relatives and our employees.

### PLEASE FOLLOW THESE INSTRUCTIONS

- per child - 1 visitor - 1 day
- for women giving birth - 1 Person accompanying childbirth
- in childbed - 1 person - 1 day
- patients - 1 person - 1 day

### VISIT TO OUR CLINIC IS UNFORTUNATELY NOT POSSIBLE IF

1. you currently have or have had symptoms in the past 14 days, which are associated with a SARS-CoV-2 virus ("Coronavirus") infection.
2. you are currently in quarantine.
3. you have had contact with a person infected with the SARS-CoV-2 virus or who had COVID-19 in the last 14 days.

### AS A VISITOR, YOU MUST

- pre-register your visit with the patient or, in the case of children, with the patient's parents/guardian. You can register as a visitor here: [www.besucheranmeldung.de](http://www.besucheranmeldung.de)
- fill out the symptom questionnaire truthfully.
- register by name with telephone number and sign the permission for data storage.
- comply with the regulations for distancing and hygiene.
- wear a mask (covering nose and mouth) and keep a minimum distance of 1.50m from other people wherever possible.

### WHEN VISITING OUR HOSPITAL, PLEASE FOLLOW THESE INSTRUCTIONS

- Unfortunately, a joint visit of both parents or legal guardians is not generally possible in our clinic for reasons of infection protection. However, parents can take turns accompanying or visiting.
- Close family members can alternate in visiting per day. Nevertheless, frequent changes should be avoided.
- A visitor other than family can only be determined for the entire stay.
- Only one visitor should be in a two-bed room. Please take consensual agreement with the visitor of the fellow patient so that distance and hygiene requirements can be observed (does not apply to accompanying persons of underaged patients).



- If possible, avoid using elevators. Should this be necessary, please comply with the distance and hygiene requirements.
- If the patient you want to visit is on an isolation ward (e.g. if COVID-19 is suspected or has been diagnosed), a visit is only possible in specific circumstances and after individual agreement with the medical staff.
- Currently, people older than 65 years should not come to our hospital as visitors.

Refraining from a visit reduces the risk of infection by a large - you can also help your loved ones with a phone call.
